

For last three decades we have been working among the most marginalised section of the community able to offer unique grassroots support to people who need it most, continuing our work in raising awareness amongst the most deprived communities to enable better protection of their rights and have been instrumental in ensuring long-term empowerment of communities among whom we work. During these years ANTODAYA has exerience of number of innovations to bring changes in the lives of the partner communities. In the past we had successfully stood with the community facing the worst epidemic of diahorreahea in Thuamul Rampur block and hope we shall be able to prepare the Community to face present COVID-19 situation with all courage and resilience.

I sincerely extend heartiest wishes to all our stakeholders including the community people, donor partners, founders of ANTODAYA and the staff members who whole heartedly grounded the innovations for the betterment of the marginalised communities. Our innovations in the field of Gravity fed pipe water supply system, Grassroot level Legal awareness and RTI clinics, running the government hospitals in PPP mode, installation of sanitary wells instead of open wells & introducing Self-employed mechanics (SEMs) to repair / maintain hand pumps involving the local youths got recognistion from the government and replicated through various projects of Government of Odisha as well as India.

Throughout this Annual Report it is our pleasure to highlight our work of the year, showing the real impact that rights advocacy and livelihoods training makes to real people's lives.

### Mission

### Area of Operation (Geographic)



Since inception ANTODAYA has been working in Thuamul Rampur block of Kalahandi district which got extended to parts of Junagarh block in the year 2001. Since 2014, our work expanded to three panchayats of Bhawanipatna block of Kalahandi district to support the community to assert their right over Forest land and resources.

### 2019-20 Highlights

Throughout the year we have been working on changing lives through advocacy and livelihoods focussed projects. Over the next few pages we outline our highlights of those works this year, and share some stories of how this has changed the lives of the people we work with. The key achievements of the year are outlined below:

Forest & Unsurvey villages to get Revenue status under FRA: Process of declaring



forest and unsurvey villages like Chachikana (Sachikana) & Semelpadar in Thuamul Rampur block and Rupangpadar village under Jugsaipatna GP of Bhawanipatna block started by demarcation of boundary as well as lands by respective Tahasils as per provisions under FRA 2006.

■ 100 farmers from Thuamul Rampur block got trained under RPL -PMKVY scheme among whom 87 farmers passed the assessment conducted by Agriculture Skill Council of India (ASCI). 274 farmers of Junagarh and Bhawanipatna blocks (passed during previous year) received their certificates from Minister of State for Energy, Govt. of Odisha Capt. Dibya Shankar Mishra in a



function organized during June 2019 at Jharbandh. Similarly **82 farmers of Thuamul Rampur block** received their Certificates from Zilla Parishad Member Shri Muralidhar Naik and other PRI members at the functions organized at their respective villages.


- 2800+ adolescents oriented through community dialogues on their health, sanitation, nutrition. The adolescents including the students at High schools are being encouraged to participate in awareness building process at Community level to make their own community people aware regarding hazards of Child marriage, open defecation. They are oriented on Handwash, Mask use and social distancing for prevention of COVID.
- 1029 community leaders took part in meetings /dialogue sessions on Health issues in 5 clusters and discussed on Mask use, Hand washing, use of toilets, benefits of safe drinking water, immunization, institutional delivery and took oath to ban Child marriage in their communities.
- Communities in villages of 12 Gram Panchayat made aware about Arresting Distress Migration project of Government of Odisha and special provisions for migration prone areas under MGNREGA. ANTODAYA got included as FNGO in the project for 12 GPs in Thuamul Rampur block.

- 198 traditional healers /faith healers/ Vaidyas made aware about Sampurna Barta at village level and encouraged to spread the message of Institutional delivery, timely immunization and to refer malnourished children to NRCs. Also established linkages with District level Vaidya Sangha and oriented its' members on the subject.
- **431 FLWs** (ASHA & Health workers/ANMs and Anganwadi Workers) of both Junagarh and Thuamul Rampur blocks oriented on KEY health issues and Communication skills
- **122 cases related to Child Rights** placed before National Commission for Protection of Child Rights during their Camp Hearing at Bhawanipatna
- **4 6019 toilets** for equal number HH in Thuamul Rampur Block constructed as the families got motivated by the adolescents trained by Sampurna Barta project of ANTODAYA. (Source: RWSS Th. Rampur)

### Few stories of success

### OSCPCR initiated action on Child Rights violation in Junagarh block, Sorishmal school got New Building

Sorishmal, a remote village in Dedara GP of Junagarh block in Kalahandi district having a primary school where 41 children read. The school building was in dilapidated condition and since June 2018 the school was functioning from one private house. But on 13th March 2019 the house owner denied to give his house for running the school as he had some family function. Since then, the children were studying in the open air under sun. Coming to know about this sad incident Chairman ANTODAYA filed a complaint at Odisha State Commission for protection of Child Rights (OSCPCR) regarding violation of Child rights and violation of Right to Education Act by the authorities. Acting upon his

complaint, the Commission had issued notice to DEO and BEO on 19 March 2019 asking action taken report by 4<sup>th</sup> April 2019. The Commission also informed the Collector regarding its' action on the matter. After the notice from OSCPCR reached the District Administration, school building work initiated and expected to be completed by July 2020. One building got completed by March 2020, where work for the additional class room building is under progress.

### Survey at Forest villages for declaring as Revenue Village initiated

Number of habitations / villages situated inside and or around the forest are still deprived of Revenue status, thus face innumerable difficulties in accessing their rights and entitlements. Noted among those villages are Chachikana (Sachikana in some records) of Kaniguma GP, Semelpadar of Karlapat GP and Tentulipadar under Kiapadar GP of Thuamul Rampur block and Rupangpadar under Jugsaipatna GP of Bhawanipatna block. These villages though

established several decades ago are still categorized as *Unsurvey Forest villages*. After 1988 survey settlement work, unsurvey villages like Kirkicha and Ushamaska of Gunupur GP in Thuamul Rampur block got revenue status in the year 2002, but the claims of other villages remained unsettled.

Meanwhile, during the year 2006 the much-awaited Forest Rights Act came into existence where there is a provision for declaring all forest and unsurvey villages as Revenue villages rekindled hopes among the

villagers of Chachikana, Semelpadar, Tentulipadar and Rupangpadar etc. Villagers have filed their claims for the same fulfilling all the requirements facilitated by ANTODAYA team way back in 2012 and again during 2015. People of those villages pursued the matter at all levels starting from SDLC to SLMC, even pleaded before their legislators. ANTODAYA team also took up advocacy work with the state administration and raised the issue at District level meetings.

Finally, after a long wait, by the direction from ST&SC development department, Government of Odisha, the Collector Kalahandi issued the Proclamation letter on 23<sup>rd</sup> July 2019. Afterwards the revenue officials and forest officials started field survey work in Chachikana, Semelpadar and Rupangpadar villages with active cooperation from ANTODAYA team. In Tentulipadar village there are some resentments from Forest department and the process got delayed.

## 17 HH in Sundhijoba village got water through Solar pumping system for their toilet use

103 families live in Sundhijoba, a tribal dominated village in Gopalpur Gram Panchayat of Thuamul Rampur block situated 13 kilometres away from Thuamul Rampur Block HQ and 62

Kilometre from Bhawanipatna. Total population of the village is 460 (Male-223 and Female-237) mostly from Tribal and SC communities, among whom almost all are small and marginal farmers depending upon agriculture, minor forest produce collection, livestock rearing and daily wages for their livelihood.

Till beginning of 2018 there were 90 households covered under Total sanitation mission and had constructed individual toilets, but the use was erratic. 73 households

were having regular access to water to use in toilets were using the toilets only during night hours. Rest 17 families were not having access to required water and only during rainy season they were using the toilets. Remaining 13 families (without Individual toilet) facilitated and encouraged by the Volunteer Amarsing Majhi are now covered under Swachh Odisha Swasth Odisha (SOSO) and Swachh Bharat mission whose toilet construction is under progress.

But the major issue in the villages relating to sanitation was irregular use of toilets (73 families having access to water and 17 HH having seasonal access to water) defeating the purpose of total sanitation and hygiene. Though ANTODAYA in collaboration with ADHIKAR and GOONJ had constructed a canal in the village to have water for the 17 HHs it was not sufficient. The volunteer for SAMPURNA BARTA program in the village Mr. Amarsing Majhi is a native of the village who took the initiative adequately supported by the adolescents in the village. Series of village meetings conducted and finally decided to approach the line departments for establishing water supply system in the village.



Use of toilet by 17 families increased

Strategically villagers contacted Agriculture department officials for solar powered water lifting system for cultivation of maize, vegetables and fruit crops in the back yard which brought positive result. The habitation/ Pada where the 17 water deprived families live now have the solar powered water supply system (installed on 16th July 2019) supplied by Agriculture department. Villagers contributed Labour (Shramdaan) and now having 24 hour water supply in the village for agriculture as

well as for use in toilet. All the 90 families having toilets regularly use toilets. Very soon, remaining 13 families shall have their toilets completed making the village 100% open defecation free.

The AWW of the village Ratnamanjari Srisuan and ASHA Mangal Dei regularly attend the meetings and trainings organised by ANTODAYA, encourage the 41 adolescents in the village to monitor the use of toilets in their family, regular immunisation of children and pregnant mothers. There are 28 children in the AWC.

### Health of Twin babies of Gobinda Majhi and Phul Dei of Karadapadar improving after SNCU care

28 years old Gobinda Majhi and his family live in Kardapadar village of Karlapat Gram Panchayat in Thuamul Rampur block. He and his 22 year old wife Phul Dei were expecting their child during April 2019. Everything was alright and Phul Dei's condition had been monitored regularly at the AWC. ANTODAYA cluster coordinator Rabinarayan Singh, who hails from the locality also following up during his visits to the village.

But, during 29th April 2019, Phul Dei experienced labor pain and it was for a long duration. Immediately Raimati Dei and Hitmain Dei (neighbors) SHG leaders of the village who got empowered through meetings, trainings, exposures etc. organised by ANTODAYA took the lead and motivated Riksha Majhi (father -in-law of Phul Dei) to shift her to District HQ hospital at Bhawanipatna. Phul Dei got admitted at the Hospital and provided with required treatment. Doctors diagnosed that she has twins in the womb. On 1st May she gave birth to twins (1 son + 1 daughter), but both the children were under weight and Phul Dei was in need of blood transfusion. The two kids got admitted in SNCU for proper care.

Phul Dei's Blood group is O+ve. Gobinda Majhi and his father Riksha Majhi were helpless as they had to arrange for O+ve blood which was a difficult task for them. ANTODAYA team following the case immediately Uр communicated the need among themselves. Dillip Kumar Das (Chairman ANTODAYA) volunteered to donate blood for Phul Dei as his blood group matches with Phul Dei's blood group. But problem was age of Dillip Kumar



Das. At 55, though he is eligible for blood donation, the technicians at the Blood Bank were bit reluctant to take the blood, advised him to go for hemoglobin test and other tests. Finally after the tests, Dillip Kumar Das donated blood for the use of Phul Dei.

Phul Dei and her new born children stayed at the SNCU for a week and discharged after their health condition got stable. She is fine now with her twin children. The two babies (Daughter Shibani weighs 4 KG 300 Gms, and Son Bhabani weighs 3 KG 900 gms) are also doing well after graduating from the SNCU.

# Damaged pipe water supply system in Ushamaska & Jhudingjor villages got renovated by Gram Panchayat

Ushamaska village of Gunupur GP in Thuamul Rampur block with 33 households (total

population 152) had the Gravity flow pipe water supply system constructed by ANTODAYA with support from OTELP project of Govt. of Odisha in the year 2011-12. But, repeated flash floods during rainy season of 2017 & 2018 the system got badly affected and many parts of the pipe line was damaged due to land slide and stone falling over the pipes making the water supply system defunct. The difficulties of the villagers increased and they again switched to stream water for their daily use. Since then

ANTODAYA team and the volunteers took it as challenge for renovation of the water supply system and pursued the matter with Gram Panchayat. ANTODAYA team and village committee became successful in including the work in the Gram Panchayat planning of 2019-20 financial year with an estimated cost of Rs. 2, 90,000/- (Two lakh Ninety

thousand). The renovation work completed during February 2020 with matching fund from MGNREGA and other components of Gram Panchayat fund. The pipe lines got relaid, intake well at the mouth of the spring got renovated and more stand posts are installed. Now there are 7 (seven) community stand posts (5 in the village, 1 each at Anganwadi center and school) supplying water (filtered through slow sand filtering system) 24X7 all the days.

Like Ushamaska village, another remote village Jhudingjor of Nakrundi Gram Panchayat also faced the same difficulties after the flash floods happened during 2017 and 2018. The villagers facilitated by ANTODAYA had pursued the matter with their Gram Panchayat resulting in renovation of their water supply system during the year.

# Empowering community to assert their Rights & **Entitlements**

#### ELECTROCUTION

# NHRC SHOCKER TO

OrissaPOST 1.Dec 2019

Bhubaneswar, Nov 30: The National Human Commission has directed Odisha Chief Secretary to submit a de tailed report on the number of elec-trocution deaths and action taken against electricity supply companies responsible for their neg-

ligence between 2014 and 2018. The Commission expressed annoyance over the huge number of com-IMPACT plaints in connection with the neg-lect by the electricity supply companies leading to repeated electrocution deaths in the state.

The commission has also asked the Chief Secretary to specify the amount of compensation paid to the victims or their families along with all relevant records. It also sought to know the number of pending cases in where the victims or the next of the kin of the deceased are yet to receive compensation due to them, reasons for not awarding compensation, the detailed remedial measures taken by the state government or its agencies to halt electrocution deaths and rules enacted by the state government detailing actions in case of negligence by the maintenance companies.

The government has also been asked to inform the Commission regarding the action taken against these companies during the fiveyear period beginning 2014.

The NHRC has issued these di-rections while hearing an application filed by Human Rights ac tivist Dilip Kumar Das seeking action against the Discom and com-pensation of Rs 3 lakh to the next of kin of one Rashmita Diggal, 62, who died September 10, 2017 when she had accidentally come into contact with a dangerously hanging live electric wire while she was at her agricultural field at Rambha in Ganjam district.

### ANTODAYA committed to empower the

communities to raise their voice against exploitation, denial of rights and entitlements and such works of ANTODAYA have been recognised by our donor partners Access to Justice Project of Department of Justice, Govt. of India and UNDP as well as other donors during preceding years. ANTODAYA continues the work among the marginalized communities, has sought the intervention seeking justice from National Human Rights Commission, NCPCR, OSCPCR in case of

violation of Human Rights, Child rights, labour rights. Rights of the migrant and bonded labours and trafficked.

- \* During 2018-19 UNICEF started supporting ANTODAYA for SAMPURNA BARTA project which is an Integrated Community Mobilization Initiative for Improved Access and Demand for Health, Nutrition & Sanitation Services in Kalahandi which continued during 2019-20 strengthening our work towards empowering the communities in accessing better health and nutrition facilities, water & sanitation etc.
- \* Considering ANTODAYA's long experience in community mobilisation and empowerment through village organisations, Department of Panchayati Raj & Drinking Water, Government of Odisha has included ANTODAYA as one of the Facilitating NGOs for implementation of Arresting Distress Migration Project in 12 Gram Panchayats of Thuamul Rampur block starting from January 2020 ..

### Seeking intervention of Judiciary and Statutory Bodies for justice

Documentation of Rights violation cases from the operation villages are being done whenever a case come to the notice of the CRVs/Cluster Organisers and ANTODAYA functionaries including the members of the Lawyer collective. Based upon the requirement of the case, complaints /cases are being filed regularly at District Legal Services Authorities (Permanent lok Adalat) and Quasi judiciary bodies like NHRC, SHRC, OSCPCR, NCPCR etc. seeking justice for the marginalised communities. The trained volunteers, Lawyer Collective members and staff members of ANTODAYA have filed number of cases related to violation of rights and prominent among those are:

- Facilitated villagers of Semelpadar, Chachikana & Tentulipadar to file their claim as well as greivances at SLMC of FRA.2006 regarding delay in initiation of process to declare their villages as Revenue villages as provisioned under Forest Rights Act. Revenue Department has intimated the Collector on theissue and the process started.
- 17 cases of Bonded labour and human trafficking filed at National Human Rights Commission
- Complaint filed during last year (2018) regarding violation of child rights of the children of Sorishmal school in Dedara GP of Junagarh block who were compelled to sit under sun due to locking of school building filed at OSCPCR and the Commission has passed order taking the matter seriously. Result on the complaint started comining as construction of school building is under progress, expected to be completed by end of June 2019.

• 122 cases related to Child Rights placed before National Commission for Protection of Child Rights during their Camp Hearing at Bhawanipatna. The Commission has directed the concerned authorities to take appropriate steps to resolve the issues. Complaints are mainly regarding lack of facilities at Anganwadi centers, schools and deprivation of children from their entitlements.

# National Consultation & VNR Review on Bonded Labour & victims of trafficking (part of United Nations Review) 29 January 2020

Poverty, unemployment and migration are interrelated phenomenon in Odisha now. Every


year millions of people, especially youths and daily wage earners go outside states for wage employment among whom several fall pray to exploitation, torture, harassment both physically as well as financially by the employers. Women often face sexual harassment by the goons of the brick kiln owners. Another dangerous trend is seen in rural areas that young girls are being trafficked in the guise of employment at different industries of other states. Labour trafficking and sex trafficking have been



increasing day by day. On the issue there was a National consultation convened jointly by United Nations, NITI Ayog and Wada Na Todo abhiyan to review the voluntary efforts on addressing the issues of trafficking and bonded labour. The consultation was coordinated by International Justice Mission where ANTODAYA was also a co-organiser. It was on Date 29 January 2020 at Pal Heights, Bhubaneswar participated by consultants and experts from NITI Aayog, UNDP and Government of India and Activists from all over India along with community people who are survivors among the Bonded labors.

### SAMPURNA BARTA initiatives for community mobilisation

UNICEF supported Project "Sampurna Barta" An Integrated Community Mobilization Initiative for Improved Access and Demand for Health, Nutrition & Sanitation Services in Kalahandi with the broad objective "To enhance the uptake of health, Nutrition and Sanitation services among vulnerable communities for improved child survival in selected GPs of Odisha, in support to the implementation of Sampurna (State





Strategy for Accelerated Reduction of IMR and MMR) & Rural Sanitation Programme" has been implemented in 24 Health Sub-centre areas of Thuamul Rampur and Junagarh blocks of Kalahandi since 1 November 2018 by ANTODAYA. The project area is one of the most challenging areas of Odisha in terms of road communication.

ANTODAYA started the activities under SAMPURNA BARTA project in the month of November 2018 and continued the work in 2019-20 with commitment for communicating complete information with the participating community in time. The project envisages empowering all the stake holders including frontline functionaries of W&CD, Health &FW, PRI, RWSS and community people like Traditional Healers, adolescents, GKS members, community leaders and PRI members.

This first phase of the project is for 2 years' time (1 Nov. 2018 to 31 October 2020) has completed 17 months of implementation by end of March 2020 and during this period some of the notable changes noticed are depicted below:

- 6019 households in Thuamul Rampur block constructed toilets for their family during the year
- 704 hand pumps repaired by RWSS (Rural Water supply & Sanitation) in Thuamul Rampur block on public deman during the year
- There has been increase in percentage of immunisation of children, ANC/Pregnancy registration, institutional delivery, attendance at VHSND & RI sessions, meeting of Gaon Kalyan Samiti, use of toilets
- Community people taking steps to stop child marriage in the villages





# Community dialogues on adolescent health issues

While conceptualizing Sampurna Barta, it is well understood that the role of youths and adolescents is vital in bringing transformative change in the behaviour of society. Accordingly, there are provisions in the project to empower the youths and adolescents through dialogues, meetings, orientations etc. Community dialogues on adolescent health

issues organised at Sub-centre as well as School level involving 2820 adolescents including school going adolescents, their parents, guardians, teachers, PRI members, Frontline functionaries where the following issues discussed,

- Child marriage and its adverse effect on society as well as on health of the adolescents, Girls not Brides
- Menstruation, a natural process in the life cycle should not be viewed as a matter of shame
- Hazards of open defecation and its impact on health
- Sanitation during menstruation, food habits of adolescents and anaemia among them
- Services available for the adolescents

Oriented at the dialogues the adolescents took oath to stop child marriage, raised their voices against child marriage. They also played the catalytic role in motivating their parents and neighbours to use toilets, to demand for toilets construction for left-out



households. The adolescents also taking part at VHSNDs and helping their community women to get proper ANC check-up and motivate the community for immunization. With the increased participation of adolescents, the FLWs are also more alert to their jobs now.

The other group of youths involved in the process is the **Sanitation Motivators** who play a vital role in open defecation free society. Getting

oriented on CLTS approach they enthusiastically took the work and working for 100% coverage under Swachh Odisha Swasth Odisha (SOSO) under Total Sanitation Mission. The Sanitation Motivators have formed WhatsApp groups at block level and share the information using the technology for quick support.

### Orientation Training of Traditional & Faith Healers (Vaidya) on 5 KEY Health Issues

Traditional & Faith Healers (Vaidya) play a key role in influencing the community in health and nutritional behaviour. Realizing the fact, Sampurna Barta project has designed orientation training for the Traditional & Faith Healers (Vaidya) in the project area aiming to mobilise them for effective engagement towards achieving the desired result in the project area. During the project period 216 vaidyas from the Project area and other parts of the districts got oriented on the objectives laid in SAMPPURNA BARTA project. It was also an opportunity for ANTODAYA to get the support of district level Vaidya Sangha "Ashwini Kumar Kalahandi Vaidya Sangha" whose President Shri Jatindra Kara belongs to

ANTODAYA project area in Junagarh block and through him the members of the Sangha from other parts of the district also got associated in the process.

During the trainings / orientation meetings vaidyas shared their own practices, knowledge in the training camps. They discussed about the modern trend of health behaviour and also the need of the community. They got informed about the health and nutrition behaviours that need to be changed as per the need of the hour to ensure Child survival and to reduce IMR & MMR in the area. They are also oriented on 5 KEY components / KEY issues related to Mother and Child health and the important Role the Vaidyas can play in bringing changes in the behaviour of the community.

For the training of the vaidyas in Junagarh block ANTODAYA team took the help of Kalahandi Ashiwini Kumar Vaidya Sangha (a registered body of the Vaidyas in Kalahandi)

who also invited few of their outstanding associates of neighbouring blocks as well as districts. Participants from neighbouring Koksara, Bhawanipatna, Golamunda and Madanpur Rampur blocks of Kalahandi and Sinapali block of Nuapada district also participated in the orientation held at Jaring Forest Nurserv on 21 July 2019. The participating Vaidyas shared their experience and after getting oriented about the 5 KEY Issues they promised to

take the message to the community in their respective areas. Hope Sampurna Barta messages shall be reaching other parts of the district through these Vaidyas. They also expressed their commitment to adopt the healthy practices for changing the Health and Nutrition behaviour of the community.

Subsequently The Ashwini Kumar Vaidya sangha also invited ANTODAYA & other like minded organisation functionaries to their district level meeting held during February 2020 to deliberate and also to orient their members about 5 key issues related to Mother and Child health.

### PRI members trained on monitoring program indicators

The relationship with PRI members already established during previous project continues to fetch support during implementation of Sampurna Barta project too. The PRI members have been involved in project activities and extending their cooperation in monitoring the VHSND & RI sessions, helping the community in getting toilets constructed, installing water points responding to community needs. To refresh them regarding their

role in monitoring the RMNCH+A activities there was plant to have orientation trainings for them during the project period. But only one orientation Training of PRI members of Thuamul Rampur block was organised where Sarpanches, PS members, ZP members were oriented on the need of monitoring the Health, sanitation, nutrition, Child care, Child Rights activities at village level. PRI members committed to monitor the VHNDs, Immunization, referral services to SNCU, Toilet construction and use and also the Chhatua mixing and distribution at designated points. Due to imposition of lock-down in March 2020, training program for the PRI members of Junagarh block area could not be organized, but their involvement remain encouraging.

### Orientation of formal health service providers on Key Health Issues

14 batches of training for FLWs / formal Health service providers like AWW, ASHA & Health



workers of the project area during the period till imposition of lockdown in the state in March 2020. Though there was plan for 21 batches of training for 431 FLWs twice in the project period 1st phase could be organised for all 431 FLWs, where the 2nd phase for only 221 FLWs were organised by the time the lockdown got imposed. In these trainings focus discussion of was on timely registration **ANC** of cases,

counselling of mothers and care givers, total sanitation, Adolescent health issues, SNCU follow-up, different schemes available for the hard to reach areas and related issues. The FLWs were encouraged to use communication training tools Mausi Kuhanti for motivating the villagers. ICDS supervisors, CDPOs, Health supervisors, PHEOs, BPMs of NHM in both the blocks extended their cooperation and they also took part as trainers.

### Other Initiatives and Convergence

ANTODAYA through its partner organisations like UNICEF, SEBA JAGAT and KARRTABYA (partners in Sampurna Barta Project) had taken up capacity building program for the staff members and Village volunteers directly involved in the project activities.

### a) Training of Trainers (ToT)

To prepare skilled team of Trainers a ToT was organised for two days (10-11 January 2019) at Bhawanipatna facilitated by Resource persons from UNICEF Mr. Rudra Prasanna Rath, Mr. Chakradhar and Mr. Santosh Behera. In the ToT, project staffs and Volunteers from the community participated from two districts (Kalahandi and Kandhamal) got training on Key Health issues, Entitlements and Schemes related to aspects of SAMPURNA BARTA. During the training session the participants also had an opportunity to interact with the District

Programme Manager, NRHM Kalahandi regarding various schemes meant for the community. The trainees also raised some vital issues related to RMNCH+A like

- Mapping of hard to reach villages and taking proactive steps for providing necessary infrastructure like road communication, telephone network facilities and Bike-ambulance to those villages for increasing institutional delivery.
- The trainees also suggested some corrective measures to referral services of mothers and children who are in need of special care.

From ANTODAYA 11 members including 3 project staff took part in the two days training.

### b) Capacity building of staff & volunteers on WASH by SLNMCH, Koraput



On 29 & 30 November 2019 Saheed Laxman Nayak Medical College and Hospital, Koraput (SLNMCH) collaboration with UNICEF organised WASH training for the SAMPURNA BARTA project team at Bhawanipatna involving team members from partner organisations of Kalahandi and Kandhamal districts. 6 members from ANTODAYA team participated in the training workshop. It was a very good

learning training for the team members who participated. Facilitators from UNICEF are very good and their facilitation helped the team members to learn some good communication training tools and also using those while communicating with the community, especially the HAND WASH song used for the Community dialogues on Adolescent health issues. Adolescents learn the Hand wash practices very quickly singing that song. Cooperation from RWSS and DPMU Kalahandi was also laudable. Through this training the skill on effective communication of the staff members and volunteers got enhanced which they used in building awareness on hand-wash, total sanitation among the community people and such initiative has excellent impact during initial stages of COVID-19.

In addition to the above activities the project team has been regularly attending the AWC to encourage Hand Washing practices among children, attending VHND sessions and meetings at ICDS as well as Sector level. Villages meetings are conducted to map the institutions at the village level. The project team also taking part at the Trainings and reviews of the FLWs organised by concerned authorities at ICDS and CHC level.

- Project staff regularly attended PMSMA (Pradhan Mantri Surakshit Matrutwa Abhiyan) at CHC level in both Junagarh and Thuamul Rampur CHCs and make the pregnant women aware on care during pregnancy (9<sup>th</sup> of every month). Project team also helped the CHC functionaries to dispplay the short films through PICO Projector.
- With ICDS Thuamul Rampur, Jointly organised Adolescent Health awareness week during RAJO festival (June 2019) at different places of Kaniguma, Karlapat, Gunupur Gram Panchayats.
- Environment protection awareness among community people through School children
- Mobilised medicines (Deworming and Vitamin A solution) from Vitamin Angels organisation and distributed among 300 needy children and pregnant women

## Convergence with NHM and school authorities for Total Sanitation campaign

On 19<sup>th</sup> July 2019 awareness campaign on Total sanitation and use of Toilets organised at Dedara village of Junagarh block in an innovative way. In the campaign NHM wing of Junagarh CHC, ICDS, ANTODAYA-Sampurna Barta, School authorities, Forest Department and Block Kala O Sanskriti Sangha (BKSS) Junagarh joined hands together to organise following activities

For the event Forest department authorities contributed required saplings of shade varieties like BAULA, BANYAN, KADAMBA, JAMUN and other species and those plants were planted by the school students and participants inside the Dedara school campus as well as inside Dedara PHC campus. NHM authorities of Junagarh coordinated the programme

well supported by Sampurna Barta team of ANTODAYA. AWW, ASHA, ANMs of Dedara and Dundelmal Gram Panchayats attended the program.

A unit from the BKSS of Junagarh block joined the program and performed cultural sows at 4 villages on Total Sanitation, use of toilet and No Child marriage.

## Baankpalas school children organised Rally on Total Sanitation in collaboration with CHC Junagarh

On the occasion of Gandhi & Shastri Jayanti (2 October 2019) awareness campaign on Total sanitation and use of Toilets organised at Baankpalas village of Junagarh block in an innovative way. In the campaign NHM wing of Junagarh CHC, ICDS, ANTODAYA-Sampurna Barta, concerned School authorities Baankpalas joined hands together to organise following activities

- 1. Rally of school children and AWWs on Swachh Bhrat,
- 2. Essay competition among school children at Baankpalas School.
- 3. Dialogue on adolescent health issues at Baankpalas school for school children

NHM authorities of Junagarh coordinated the programme well supported by Sampurna Barta team of ANTODAYA. AWW, ASHA, ANMs of Baankpalas Gram Panchayats attended the program. The students of Baankpalas School took part in an Essay competition on SWACHH Bharat organised by CHC Junagarh & NHM. Along with the community dialogue

on Adolescent health issues discussion on Total Sanitation by the NHM authorities organised at the school and the winners of the essay competition got prize from the NHM. During the program Medical officer of Mobile Health Unit of Junagarh CHC, Headmaster and teachers of the school, CWC member Sri Sudhanshu Kumar Nanda, concerned AWWs and Sampurna Barta Team of ANTODAYA discussed about health, nutrition, sanitation and Child rights issues.

### Sharing the learning with District Administration

Sampurna Barta project is based on the belief that, coordinated effort of community, line departments and CSOs will bring desired result in improved health and nutrition services in the hard to reach areas. In Kalahandi all the partner organizations (ANTODAYA, SEBAJAGAT & KAARTABYA) have been cooperating and coordinating with the line departments (ICDS, H&FW, PR&DW, NHM) at the district as well as project areas for achieving the desired result. After initial discussion with the Collector and District Magistrate

during December 2018, regular contacts are being made with CDMO, NHM, DSWO, DPMU, CWC, DCPU, concerned ICDS, RWSS, Block offices, CHCs for better coordination and cooperation at the district as well as block level. Efforts are made to converge with the respective Gram Panchayats for better coordination on the ground. Coordination meetings and sharing workshops are being organised at District level as well as at Organisation level for sharing the information and also to seek feedback for better implementation of the activities at village level.

**Quarterly Coordination meetings** organised at District level jointly by all the three partner organisations involving the CDMO, DCPU, CWC, DSWO, RWSS, District Planning Officer,

UNICEF representative, Media persons and District Welfare officer to share the updates on Sampurna Barta project initiatives at block level. It also gives a better platform for experiences, exchanging the stories, bottle necks, challenges and ideas on the issues related to health, nutrition, sanitation, child marriage and child rights. There were 5 quarterly meetings till imposition of lock-down in March 2020 and in all the meetings the officials had been extending their cooperation

wholeheartedly and their feedback on the actions by Sampurna Barta partners helped in fine tuning the activities.

### Livelihoods Initiatives



82 farmers recognised out of 100 farmers trained



For food and livelihood security of the target community ANTODAYA has been working and supporting them to improve their skill through trainings in order to manage the natural resources like land, water, forest and livestock mobilising resources from different support agencies including OTELP and other government departments. ANTODAYA encourages the target people to work for soil and moisture conservation through watershed approach in all the livelihood activities for enhancement of the produtivity of the natural resources aiming to achieve food security.

During 2019-20 ANTODAYA continued the efforts on the following lines

• Farmers training on various crops with support from Gram Tarang of Centurion University under PMKVY of Government of India

- Skill building of the target community on labour budget and work under MGNREGA.
   Facilitated villagers in Thuamul Rampur bock to prepare Annual work plan and Budget for MGNREGA work in the coming year
- Taking up various livelihood activities and enterprenuership at household level as well as at group level in Thuamul Rampur Block.

# Recognising Prior Learning of Farmers through training under PMKVY

Farmers are the backbone of Food security of the nation. In our state farmers grow varieties of crops and have abundant knowledge on farming. But their knowledge is not yet recognised by any institutions /organisations. At the same time farmers also need updated information about the technologies developed in the country in farm sector for enhancement of their production. Realising the fact Ministry of Agriculture, Government of India has introduced RPL (Recognising Prior Learning) training of the farmers under Pradhan Mantri Koushal Vikas Yojana (PMKVY) under which farmers are to go for 10 days training on crop cultivation, vermin compost, organic farming etc and get certified for their knowledge and learning.

To have such farmers with recognition in Kalahandi district, ANTODAYA established partnership with Gram Tarang of Centurion University of Technology and Management (CUTM) Parlakhmeundi, who are the implementing partner for this project under Ministry of Agriculture. Under this partnership ANTODAYA proposed to train 1500 farmers (500 each in Thuamul Rampur, Junagarh and Bhawanipatna blocks) of Kalahandi district, for which CUTM providing financial support as well as Qualified Trainers.



This intervention started during previous year (2018-19) and continued in 2019-2020. In the year 2018-19 the trainings were in Junagarh and Bhawanipatna blocks by which 389 farmers got trained. During 2019-20 there were only two batches of trainings organised in Thuamul Rampur block where 100 farmers got trained. Those 100 farmers are from Tangri, Adri and Tentulipada villages of Adri Gram Panchayat and BadaDerla, Dumerpadar and Bissamgiri villages of Dumerpadar. They got training on Organic farming & Vermin Compost out of whom 82 farmers passed the assessment test conducted by ASCI.

During the training certified trainers on the particular subject supported by B.SC Agriculture students of Centurion University stayed with the farmers and imparted training. Local PRI

members of the concerned Gram Panchayats, block and the agriculture department officials extended their whole hearted support.

For the farmers of Junagarh and Bhawanipatna block (came out successful during 2018-19 batches of RPL-PMKVY training) the certificate distribution ceremony was organised on 13 June 2029 at Jharbandh Village Weekly Market yard in Junagarh

block where Minister of state for Energy, MSME & Home Government of Odisha Shri Dibya Shankar Mishra joined as Chief guest and distributed certificates to 274 farmers. In the event PRI members of TalJaring, Kendupati, Nandol, Chingudisar, Kutrukhamar, Mahichala, Meriabandhli, Bhainriguda Gram Panchayats also attended and encouraged the farmers.




#### Comments of financial performance



#### **ANTODAYA**

Since its inception in 1989, ANTODAYA has been working in one of the most vulnerable and drought prone Districts of Orissa, India namely Kalahandi. Prior to its formation, its members have been working on the issues of the tribals' most sensitive issue of land alienation prevailing in tribal dominated block of Thuamul Rampur. The result of this bitter struggle yielded in restoration of around 175 acres of agricultural land to poor Paraja Kandha tribals of Thuamul Rampur block. Thus arose the need of giving shape and direction to the endeavors of some committed groups of people and a solid foundation of ANTODAYA was laid with the help of tribal people of the area in 1989.

To bring pro-poor changes in laws of the state ANTODAYA has facilitated several advocacy campaigns in the state around the issues like peoples' right over collecting and marketing of Non-timber forest produces, equal ownership of women over the property of their in-laws, compliance of the section 4(1) B of the RTI act -2005 at the government offices etc. and succeeded in bringing changes. To support the community in accessing justice ANTODAYA has established Right to Information clinics and Land Rights resource centres. These clinics empower local people through information and knowledge of their rights. Through increased knowledge of legal rights and entitlements ANTODAYA has enabled thousands of local people to access property, education, employment and public services. This has been achieved in collaboration with UNDP and Government of India partners, encouraging increased participation in political and legislative processes, and raising awareness of relevant welfare schemes.

ANTODAYA also has extensive experience in holistic village development projects, encompassing water, sanitation, livelihoods and agricultural projects which are implemented with notable innovations.

To support the grassroots work, ANTODAYA also engages in policy development, and pursues justice through the filing of cases and complaints with appropriate official bodies. Currently ANTODAYA has filed two cases with the High Court of Odisha regarding the poor quality of the Mid Day Meal (MDM) scheme provided at local schools and on the issue of threat to the life and property of poor due to Electrocution. ANTODAYA also regularly seeks the intervention of the Commissions (NHRC, SHRC, NCPCR, NCW, NCSC etc) on its own and also with the help of the Lawyer friends of the locality in the matter of violation of the rights of the poor and marginalised by filing the complaints as and when such incidences occur.
